I am particularly pleased that the Railroad Reform, Enhancement, and Efficiency Act (R2E2) - as approved by the Commerce Committee - was included as a title of the bill. SPRC is comprised of state leaders from across the United States and our mission is to promote the research, development, implementation, operation, sustainability, and expansion of publicly-supported intercity passenger rail (IPR) services. The inclusion of rail into the highway bill is a significant step which is recognized and appreciated by our members.
